



## Job Posting - Part-time Outdoor Education Instructor

### About New Treks

We teach outdoor adventure education in the classroom. During the school year, we partner with Title 1 schools to offer elective courses with the hope to increase access to the outdoors. Classes are a combination of lecture-based learning, experiential learning, class time field trips, hands-on projects, and half and full day trips. We teach from the classroom, local green spaces, and at other partnered locations.

### About the position

Earliest start date: 03 Jan 2023

Your primary role will be teaching multiple outdoor education classes at various schools. Curriculum includes rock climbing, backpacking, paddling, weather reading, team building, survival skills, and more. Each lesson includes social-emotional learning as a way for students to gain transferable skills. You will follow the curriculum provided to you, while incorporating your own teaching style. You will start as an assistant instructor who will shadow and assist a current instructor. Once you have progressed you will be asked to teach classes on your own. This timeframe is determined by your experience, confidence, work ethic, and abilities.

### Other Tasks:

- Half or Full day outings. Can include indoor/outdoor climbing, paddling, hikes, snowboard/ski lessons, and more.
- Transporting students to and from activity locations.
- Creating new curriculum

Summer programming is filling up and we may need your help. Depending on summer needs you may be asked to work some weekends. This ranges from single-day activities to multi-day overnights. We currently work with Youth and Family Services, Behavioral Health Centers, Schools, and more for summer programs.

### Pay

Pay starts at \$18/hr with possible pay increase with certifications, experience, and after your training period. You will be working 20 hours per week.
